RESEARCH

As a distinctive feature, my research approach uses insights from biology and psychology to analyse key business phenomena, such as firm/industry co-evolution and competition, corporate crises/turnarounds, and start-ups' survival/death. Through literature reviews, conceptual modelling and qualitative analyses, I have mostly focused on real estate, automobile, and Unicorns. Overall, together with journal articles, recent works also include: Abatecola G. (2025), Enterprise Evolution, Survival and the Businesstype: From Research to Practice, Routledge.

TEACHING

Teaching, mentorship and supervising span undergraduates to executives. At Tor Vergata, I have taught General Management-related subjects in English (General Management [bachelor]; Strategic Management/Enterprise Evolution [graduate]) and Italian (Managerial Decision Making, graduate), to classes of small (10-20), medium (≈50) or large (>100 students) size. Over time, achieved highly favourable teaching evaluations and gratifying placement of supervised students; many of them currently serve in multiple managerial positions, especially for international consulting brands. Teaching experience also includes universities around the globe, such as Lee (US), Sheffield (UK), Metropolia (Finland), Inholland (The Netherlands) and ISCEM (Portugal). In Italy, I have also taught Problem Solving and Decision Making in the Advanced School of the Italian Police (2006-2011, Ministry of the Interior), European University of Rome (since 2023, bachelor lab), Advanced School of Criminal Execution (2024, Ministry of Justice), and in a number of Master programmes at Tor Vergata. Mainly research driven, teaching is mostly interactive, including: a) combined talks with industry leaders from primary public/private institutions; b) problem solving project works; c) classroom challenges; d) software simulations; e) case studies, f) role playing games.
